


#### THE SIXTH FORM STUDENT HANDBOOK



How are the *Indicator Grades* calculated?


They are neither targets nor predicted grades





## E<sup>3</sup> DIPLOMA



### WHY AN E<sup>3</sup> DIPLOMA?

#### The E<sup>3</sup> Diploma:

- encourages students to explore their extra-curricular interests
- rewards students who contribute to the wider life of the school
- develops students' ability to record their achievements
- assists students with their post-school applications
- focusses on the efforts of the 'whole person'




#### WHO MIGHT BE INTERESTED?

#### Anyone!

Eventually, there will be three diplomas available:

- Junior (KS3)
- Intermediate (KS4)
- Senior (Year 12)



In Year 12 this year, all students complete the Senior Diploma.

#### E<sup>3</sup> DIPLOMA - ENGAGE...

Students should engage with their community, both inside and outside school.

During **Year 12**, students should **complete** and **log** hours of community service / volunteering / extra curricular activities.

Time spent with clubs, societies, sports fixtures & practices, music / drama rehearsals, assisting with a junior class *all* counts.

Awards will be given for *Bronze* (10 hours), *Silver* (25 hours) and *Gold* (50 hours).



#### E<sup>3</sup> DIPLOMA - EXPLORE...

Students should *explore* an area beyond the curriculum - completed through the *enrichment* programme.

Students are to *sign up* to and *complete* one course from those on offer.

Achievement will be shown by attendance and completion of a relevant assessment by the area teacher.




#### E<sup>3</sup> DIPLOMA - EXCEL...

Students will display their ability to excel beyond what we cover in lessons.

They will need to prepare a **15 minute** speech / presentation / workshop on an area beyond the curriculum. This might be on an **academic** topic, insight into something they **participate** with as part of **Engage**, or an **interest** they have.


These will be *presented* during *morning* registration.




#### E<sup>3</sup> SENIOR DIPLOMA

Students are required to *track* their progress in a *logbook*, which will provide a *record* of their achievements. Each section will need to be *signed off*.

Certificates will then be awarded to recognise students' achievements.






