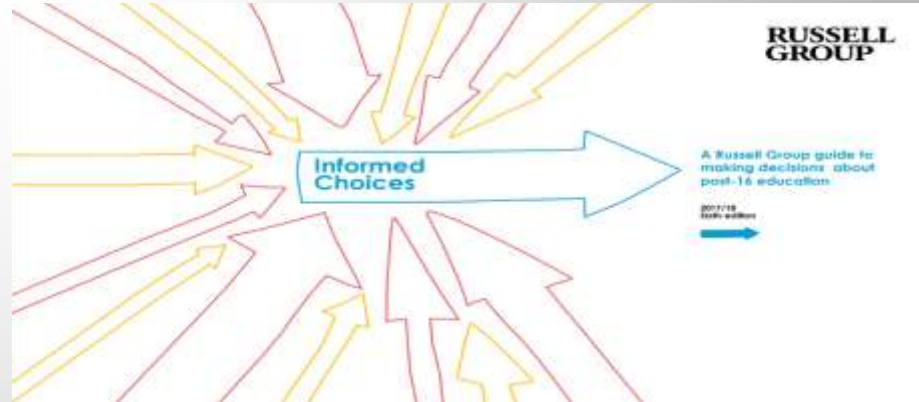

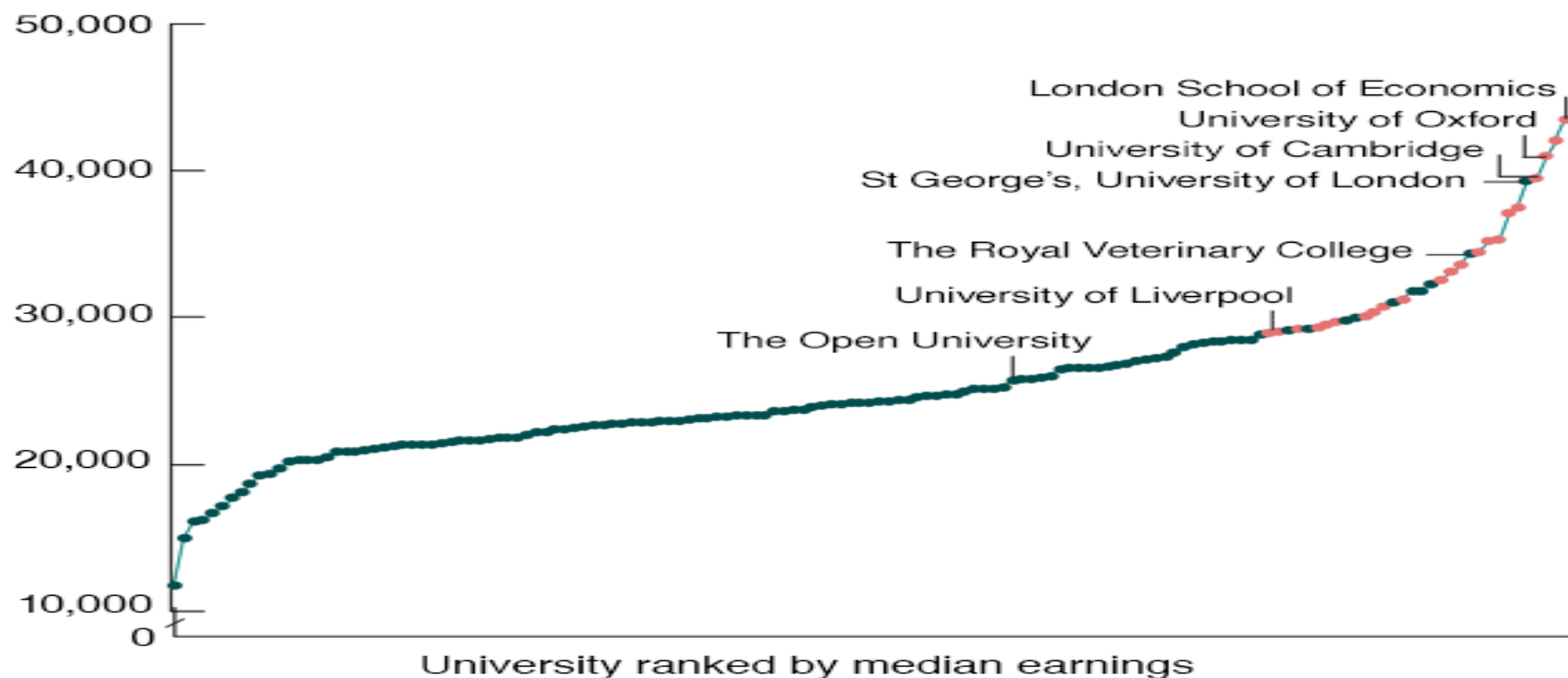

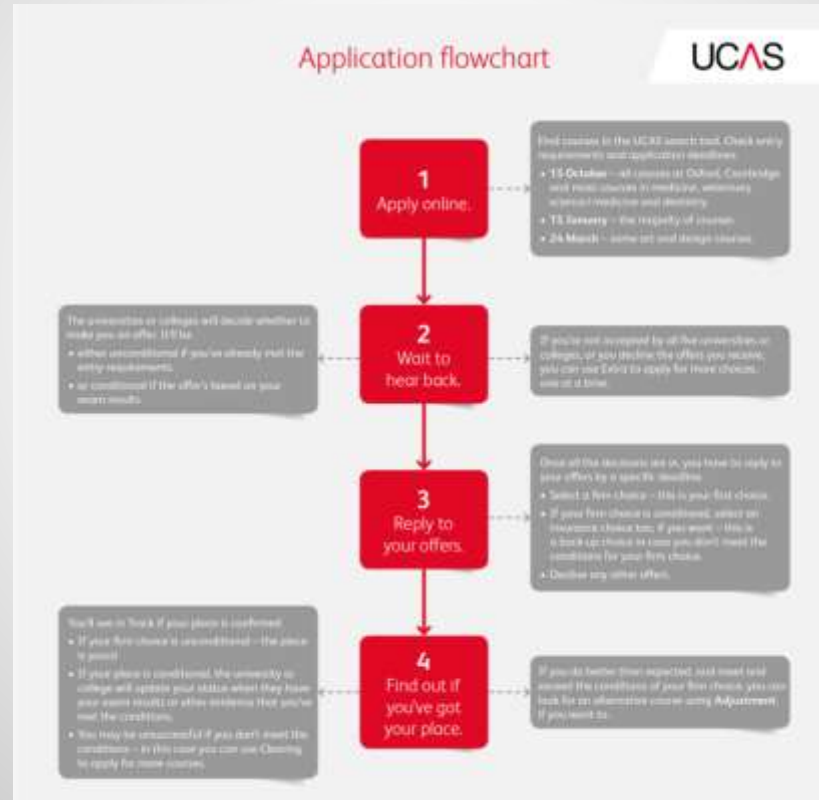

The application process





‘APPLY’ – the UCAS Internet Applications System

- **Completed online with a password**
- **The student can work from any online device**
- **The UCAS referee can check on the student’s progress at any stage**
- **The completed application is sent online to UCAS**



‘APPLY’ – the UCAS Internet Applications System

- **Students can follow the progress of their application through UCAS Track**
- **The UCAS form is the responsibility of the student; we will advise, but what goes on the form is up to the student.**



University choices

- Five University choices
Universities do not see the student's other choices
- Payment to UCAS by debit / credit card for 2022 was £22 for one / £26.50 for up to five
- Medicine, Vet Med, Dentistry only 4



UCAS grades

- **Based on performance in the Summer Year 12 internal UCAS exams.**
- **Work throughout the year will be considered but the examination takes precedence**
- **Not based on what the student wants/needs**



UCAS grades

- **Students must make sure that they apply for a spread of universities with a range of entry requirements – they should never focus only on the most prestigious ones, especially for the most competitive courses**



Additional tests

**BMAT - for certain Medicine, Veterinary Medicine
and related courses**

UCAT - for Medicine or Dentistry

LNAT - for Law

STEP - for some Mathematics degrees



Admissions Tests

- Some universities may have additional admissions tests for certain courses or may require Portfolios of work to be produced.
- Both Oxford and Cambridge have additional admissions tests – MAT, HAT, PAT, ELAT, CAT, MLAT, TSA...
- *It is the student's responsibility to ensure they are registered for any additional tests they need to sit.*



The UCAS form

This has sections on the following:

- **Personal Details**
 - **University and Course choices**
 - **Qualifications**
 - **Jobs and Work Experience**
 - **Personal Statement**
 - **School Reference inc. Predicted UCAS grades**

- **Most Universities will not interview you prior to giving you an offer, therefore this is all they will see!!**

UCAS The UCAS process

- **Summer internal UCAS exams 6th-15th June**
- **Friday 17th June UCAS day. Advice on application process & writing Personal Statements.**
- **6th July – UCAS exam results & UCAS grades**
- **July - Sept - working on UCAS application so that the form is ready as early as possible in the Autumn term of Year 13**
- **UCAS forms checked and corrected and references added: 2- 3 week process.**



University replies

- **Correspondence is through UCAS.**
- **Possible invitation to attend an interview, applicant day, audition or submit a portfolio.**
- **Most offers will be conditional on gaining certain grades or points at A level eg. AAB/136 points**
- **Follow the progress of application on UCAS Track.**
- **When all offers are received students choose a 'firm' and an 'insurance' offer. The insurance choice should be a sensible, back up choice with lower grade requirements.**



University replies

- If students fail to meet offers they can go through 'EXTRA' and then 'CLEARING'.
- If students surpass offers they can go through 'ADJUSTMENT' and effectively upgrade.

The personal statement

- The most important section of the form
- It should have an academic focus and be directly related to the chosen course
- Applicants should demonstrate enthusiasm, aptitude and suitability for chosen course
- Relevant further reading, research & work experience should be included
- This is an opportunity for applicants to ‘sell themselves’
- UCAS referees will give guidance



The personal statement

What can be done now?

- **Further reading research**
- **Work experience**
- **MOOCs**
- **Courses, workshops, seminars & lectures**



The personal statement

It's easy for admissions tutors to tell the difference between a personal statement that demonstrates preparation over a long period of time and one that has been done at the last minute.



The personal statement

- **Make sure you have the right experience, reading and focus for the course you apply for.**
- **Get on with your application - offers are finite**
- **Consider applying to Summer Schools**
- **Attend Open Days - is there are preference for a campus or a city-based university?**
- **Be realistic. Students should only apply for those courses with the grade requirements that they are predicted to achieve.**
